Sunday's reading tells us that Saul is on his way to Damascus to persecute the Disciples of Christ. Saul was later called Apostle Paul (Acts 13:9.) The symbol for the Apostle Paul is found on the New Testament side between the first and second panel in from the right. It is the sword on the open Bible with the Latin words, Spiritus Gladius, Spirit Sword as found in Ephesians 6: 17-18.
